



Refugee Health & Wellness Interdisciplinary Seminar

This **year-long** integrated seminar and practical experience will provide qualified undergraduate and graduate students in Medicine, Social Work, Dentistry, Nursing, Public and Global Health with the opportunity to apply best practices in refugee health and wellness in a real-world setting. After an initial orientation to refugee resettlement and health care and mental health needs, students will work in inter-professional teams with refugee clients resettled in the Triangle to provide health and mental health systems access, case management, and health promotion education. In seminar, students will define learning goals in collaboration with faculty who will support their ongoing engagement with refugees and learn from local and statewide experts in the field of refugee health and wellness.

For qualified undergraduates and graduate students enrolled in the schools of

Medicine, Social Work, Dentistry, Nursing, and Public Health

Seminars will be held approximately every other Wed. from 6-7:30pm and require a commitment of 1.5 hours per week for direct work with refugees, including home visits, case management, and other health support. This PUBH course will be hosted through the Public Health Leadership Program of the School of Public Health (cross-listed as FMME 602 at UNC SOM). Maximum enrollment of 30. Students must register for both semesters (1.5 credits per semester)
